Choosing the right course for you will help you achieve your goals.

We will work with you to help you plan a personal programme of learning which will meet your individual needs, aims and aspirations.

This will enable you to:

- recognise your starting point
- undertake an initial assessment (if applicable to your course)
- help you understand where you can progress to for further learning or employment.

Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG)

To help with your planning we can offer you an Information, Advice and Guidance interview with a qualified advisor at any of our learning centres.

Dudley Adult and Community Learning has a Matrix award for the quality of this service. This means that:

- we offer a safe and welcoming environment to discuss your learning needs
- we ensure that all the information we provide is impartial and confidential
- we have qualified staff to help you make the right choices.

Additional support

We can offer you additional support to help you succeed in your learning. This includes:

- help for learners with a disability
- specialised equipment such as ICT software and adjustable desks
- information and resources supplied in alternative formats on the courses
- reduced fees for adults who meet eligible criteria such as those on a low income or who are unemployed.

How to find a course and enrol

For some courses, such as English, maths and ESOL, you may need to do an initial assessment to check which level you are working at before you enrol.

How to pay

Payment is by cash or debit card at the venue where your course is held.

Fees and concessions

Most courses in the brochure include the fees payable. Where it says 'ring for details' these courses may offer concessions and reduced fees.

English and maths courses are free if you do not already have a GCSE grade C or above in these subjects. Family Learning courses are also free. ICT courses for complete beginners through to Level 1 qualifications are also free if you have not previously achieved an ICT qualification at that level or above.

Many of our learners are eligible for a free or discounted course. Concessions may be available for people who receive certain means-tested benefits, including:

- Job Seekers Allowance (JSA)
- Employment Support Allowance Work Related Activity Group (ESA / WRAG)
- Income Support
- Pension Credit
- Housing Benefit
- Working Tax Credit

To receive a concession, you must provide proof of entitlement and bring proof of identity at enrolment. This includes any of the following:

- National Insurance Number
- proof of identity (with current address)
- proof of benefit (if applicable)
- up-to-date proof of UK residency.

You will need to pay a full fee if you are not eligible for a concession and will also have to pay any exam or assessment fees.

Note Annual income is under the threshold of £30,000 for West Midlands Combined Authority funded learners or £20,319 for ESFA funded learners who can produce evidence to that effect.



Different ways of learning with Dudley ACL

We offer different ways of learning to meet the needs and lifestyles of our residents, which includes offering courses in our centres, community venues and online.

When you enquire about joining one of our courses we will confirm how that course will be delivered. Please let us know if you have any issues that may prevent you from learning in the classroom or online.

On-site classroom - These courses take place in our Neighbourhood Learning Centres or other local community venues. If you are enrolled on one of these courses you will have every lesson in a classroom. You will be required to attend these classes on the same day and time every week for the duration of the course.

Virtual classroom - These courses are online. The classes happen at a set time and day each week for the duration of the course. You will need IT equipment and access to the internet to join a virtual classroom.

Online classes - These courses are online. You can do these at home at any time that is convenient for you. You will have to complete your course within a set period of time that we will confirm with you when you enquire about the course.

I want to use my skills in English to get a new job. Currently I work in a care home because I like to help people, but I am now considering working in a hospital, maybe training to be a nurse eventually.



Maths

Improving your maths skills will help you in everyday life and work situations. Having a good understanding of maths gives you confidence to build your problem solving and analytical skills to be able to study other subjects, or even help you to support your child with their homework.

If you want to apply for higher level courses or are looking for a job or a career change, then gaining a nationally recognised qualification in maths may help you to achieve this.

We offer functional skills maths courses from Entry Level to Level 2. These classes are taught face to face in the classroom.

Classes are held weekly over a period of months. If you need to gain a qualification in a shorter timeframe then you can join our Fast-Track Maths courses online. Good IT skills and a reliable internet connection will be needed to get the most out of online learning.

Before joining a maths course, all learners will have an initial assessment to identity the correct starting point and to ensure that you are on the right level course. Maths courses are free if you do not already have a GCSE grade C or above in this subject. Exam and assessment fees are also free.


